EXECUTIVE SUMMARY



At Victory4All our vision is to provide loving care and excellent Christian education to break the cycle of poverty.

Through our unique Victory4All way, we create tangible opportunities for children and their families that live in under resourced communities. The aim is to move them beyond poverty and help them reach their full potential. Our various programs and schools are aimed at providing a way for every child that is part of Victory4All to have access to the resources and opportunities they need to one day move beyond the systemic cycle poverty they live in today.

In 2024, our communities in South Africa daily faced significant challenges, such as: food prices continued to escalate, unemployment increases as does gang driven violence in the area. All of our families and children are negatively impacted by these challenges.

Regardless, we continued to see significant growth in all the Victory4All Programs. If not for the opportunities provided by Victory4All over 730 children and families in Jeffreys Bay and Humansdorp would be stuck in the cycle of poverty.

With passion and purpose we focussed on the positive growth and development of each program/school. Thus we ensured we are providing not only the essential basic needs of each child, but enabling them to dream the big dreams God has for them. It was a year of giving hope and opening up worlds of new opportunities for every child.

Like a city on a hill, our schools, homes, and programs have continued to offer tangible, long-term hope. Over the past 22 years we have grown from a headlamp to a spotlight. Now we are able to provide the best opportunities for 737 children and their families from as young as 4 months old. We can see how the generational inequalities are being broken in families.

Through our resilient presence, we continue to see the cycle of poverty being broken.

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

We make a lasting impact in our community by focussing on four main areas:

Foster Care services:

Victory4All Homes provide full-time care for 31 children in 6 foster homes in Jeffrey's Bay & Humansdorp. We also provide support for community based foster care through our team of social workers.

Excellent Basic Education

- Noah's Ark Preschool, serves 148 children from 4 months to 5 years old.
- Kings College is our independent Christian primary & high school, with 423 learners from Gr. R - Gr. 10 in 2024.

Disability Education & Care:

- Rainbow Angels Day Care is a Partial Care Centre for 20 children with severe physical and mental disabilities, aged between 5 and 18 years.
- Rainbow Special Needs Centre is a school for over 78 children with various special needs, learning difficulties or disabilities.

Youth Development and Training

- Rainbow Youth Skill Centre is a practical centre for 37 young people with disabilities or learning barriers between the ages of 16 - 30 years. We have various skills programs i.e. catering, sewing, music and agriculture. In 2024 we also ran a Plant Production learnership for 10 young people.
- O Soete Swaan is our own social enterprise that provides sustainable employment for young people with disabilities. Over 3000 stroopwafels (a syrup waffle from The Netherlands) are produced per day, which are sold across South Africa & even Africa.



VICTORY4ALL HOMES

Jeffrey's Bay and Humansdorp

Our mission is to provide excellent facilitated, supported and supervised, community-based foster care for orphans and vulnerable children.

A New Beginning: The Opening of Our 7th Foster Home

We are thrilled to share the success of opening our 7th foster home, which is now under the loving care of a new foster mom. The first child to join her in this new home was a young boy. This new beginning for this boy and his foster mom is a beacon of hope for our program, demonstrating the life-changing impact of foster care done with love and purpose.

The power of academic dedication:

The story of one of our foster girls is one of resilience and determination. This dedicated foster child has been studying exceptionally hard, pushing herself to excel in her academics. Her commitment has paid off, as she is now preparing to enter Grade 12 next year. This is a significant achievement that embodies the potential within every foster child. Her progress not only highlights her hard work, but also represents the success of a supportive environment that encourages educational goals and personal ambition.

The Impact of Biological Family Day Visits:

Our program has seen remarkable improvements in the emotional well-being of children due to our structured biological family day visits. These visits, which form part of the reunification efforts, provide the children with a sense of belonging and continuity. The opportunity to spend meaningful time with their families, even for a day, has led to increased happiness, emotional stability, and a strengthened sense of identity among our children. The positive impact is evident in their smiles, behaviour, and renewed hope for their futures.







NOAH'S ARK PRESCHOOL

Our mission embraces a Godly learning centre. Our aim is to provide a firm foundation of skills to ensure ongoing success in primary school.

Significant moments from 2024

) Impact of the Baby Group:

Our baby class opened in 2023, and a noticible impact in developmental skills in our older classes. Our aim in this class is to provide excellent quality care for the vital first 1000 days of the baby's life.

Story of Hope:

There are many stories of hope and miracles. In one such instance a little boy of two years of age had a successful eye operation. His eyesight continues to improve as we surround him and the family in prayer.

Garden of Hope:

Our vegatable garden teaches our pupils. The skils of planting, caring and harvesting healthy food. This activity enhances the behaviours associated with our values of creting and appreciate and care for the world.

O Sports Day Joy:

The Sports Day emphisised the importance of family. Mom's and Dad's play a vital role in encouraging excellence in their children. We aim to improve unity in our families by having family day events.

Growing together:

Our prayer sessions twice a week strengthens us and our relationships with parents as well. Our prayer time is also a time to give thanks to the Lord for prayers answered and situations changed. There is a beautiful atmosphere of peace and unity at the school amongst children, staff and parents.

Never giving up:

We emphasise the everyone is capable of positive mindset and we encourage pupils to behave in a manner that is uplifting to everyone.

Beyond the classroom

This year we provided many opportunities for the learners to learn and grow outside of the classroom. From our Worship Praise Party where each class presented a dance; ending 6th in a national recycling competition; class outings and outreaches. Every unique opportunity expanded our learners' world and inspired them to dream!

Sports Development

Every year we grow our sports programs. Sports is not only a significant part of the development of children, it inspires hopes and dreams and opportunities for the learners. This year our Netball girls did exceptionally well and competed with surrounding schools with much success. Our soccer team keeps getting better and our rugby program is developing well. We also did well with our annual athletics. It was also with great excitement that we added two new sports – table tennis and cricket.

Ocaring for the community:

During each month, the learners bring non perishable food to their class and then once a month it gets given to the school social worker who then ensures it gets distrubuted to the families who most in need in the school. This year the learners also handed out soup & bread to people waiting in line at the local clinic as well as donating 4 dog kennels and dog food to the local animal rescue.

Ocaring for the heart:

This year we opened our prayer room at the school. This space is used for teachers and parents and community members to pray for the school. It is also used for counselling & discipleship sessions with our school pastor.

For many learners, the tour symbolised breaking barriers, both geographically and personally. The collaborative efforts between learners, parents, and educators played a pivotal role in making this tour a reality. This journey brought everyone closer. The moments of teamwork highlighted the power of unity and how collective efforts can turn dreams into reality. Once in Cape Town, the exposure to the city's vibrant culture, rich history, and breathtaking landscapes became a catalyst for transformation. Learners who had never ventured beyond their local surroundings experienced firsthand the vast opportunities the world holds. Activities such as visiting Robbin Island, Table Mountain, and historical landmarks instilled pride and a deeper understanding of their country's heritage. Beyond the academic and cultural enrichment, the tour inspired learners to dream bigger and work harder. It also strengthened relationships, as learners discovered new strengths and talents within themselves and among their peers. Significant moments from 2024

Transformed life:

When Antonia Zealand (14 yrs old), started at Rainbow two years ago, he was a withdrawn, timid and extremely shy boy. He never spoke a word, we even thought he had a speech impediment. He cried on his first day and was so frightened to go to school. Today he is a totally transformed boy. His confidence has grown so much, that his excellence as a goal keeper in soccer is being rewarded with a trophy at our upcoming prize giving.

Power of Creative Expressions:

Our concert in September was a great highlight. There was a wonderful atmosphere of joy and celebration, and as always, the attendance of the parents was very good: the hall was packed to overflowing. This year there was not supposed to be a drama, but a few enthusiastic learners came to the principal and asked if they could write their own play and perform it themselves. This was an amazing achievement of creativity, initiative and confidence on behalf of the learners – who usually come to Rainbow Centre feeling like failures with nothing to offer. We had many good laughs at the rehearsals, and the final performance was quite original. They kept changing the script every time they did it!

Ocelebrating Christmas:

This year we were able to host a very special end of the year christmas party for all of the Rainbow Centre Learners - with presents and treats and lots and lots of joy. It was deeply special that each learner received a Christmas present this year.

She was only part of school for a week when she said to the teacher - "I am so happy here I dont want to leave school"

Our mission is to create opportunities for young people with learning or mental disabilities to be launched into adulthood in a practical and sustainable way.

Significant moments from 2024

First ever Skill Centre Camps:

This year we hosted a winter and summer camp for the learners at Skill Centre. These camps created vital safe spaces for learners and facillitators to connect and build deep meaningful relationships. It was both filled with transformative learning and play.

Opportunities to grow

Throughout the year there were creative ways for the learners to grow. There was a "Dress up with confidence day" that empowered the learners to have more confidence in who they are. Our plant producation learners also became mini creators when they had to create vegatables out of recycled materials. The creativity was insipiring!

Graduation

This year 10 learners graduated with a NQF-Level 2 Plant Producation Certificate. Now they are qualified to go work on farms and even able to go and do further studies. This was also a hard year for this group as two of the learner sadly passed away.

Markets & Sales:

The learners had the opportunity to participate in various markets in the last part of their year. Learning about marketing and sales and entrepeneurship.

Over 3000 stroopwafels (a syrup waffle from The Netherlands) are produced per day, which are sold across South Africa & even Africa. Currently, we employ 13 young people on a full-time basis.

We supply various stores, bakerys and cafe's. Significantly, we are the main supplier of two big companies, Vida e Cafe as well as Seatlle Coffee company.
